NAVIGATOR'S REPORT Worthy Sir Knights

I hope that each and every Sir Knight has enjoyed a very Happy Easter. As we begin the Month of April we enter into the 4th and final quarter of this Assembly Year. Please try to attend at least one Assembly Meeting during this final quarter. Our elections will occur at the meeting on May 16th. Plan to attend this meeting and cast your vote for next year's Assembly Officers.

I am writing this report on March 29th, the 125th anniversary of the founding of the Knights of Columbus in 1882. It is amazing how that small group of catholic men has, over the years, expanded into an international society of over 1.7 million men and over 1200 councils. Today members of the Order are found in the United States, Canada, Mexico, the Philippines, Puerto Rico, Guatemala, Panama, Cuba, Guam, the Virgin Islands, the Dominican Republic, the Bahamas and most recently into Poland. The good works of the order are too numerous to mention in this brief report but are well known to all Knights throughout the world. We must do all in our power to insure that the Order continues to grow and its good works spreads. One of the guiding principles of the Knights of Columbus has long been: "Don't keep the Faith – spread it!"

We can all do our part to aid in this growth by an active participation in the works of the Order and by doing all in our power to sustain the growth of our Order. To this end, we members of the 4th Degree shall have two opportunities to increase our membership. There will be an exemplification of the 4th Degree on Saturday, May 19th at Norfolk Council 367 in Norfolk and later in the year another Exemplification will be held on October 20th at the Holiday Inn Koger Center in Richmond. Please make an effort to bring these exemplifications to the attention of your home council. Now is the time to begin recruiting candidates of either of these two degrees. Noteworthy Information

As you may know, March 29, 2007 marked the 125th anniversary of the Knights of Columbus. The Supreme Council has established the website <u>http://www.kofc.org/eb/en/anniversary/index.html</u> to help commemorate this momentous occasion. The following information is taken from that website:

"On March 29, 1882, the Connecticut state legislature officially chartered the Knights of Columbus, a fraternal benefit society founded by Father Michael J. McGivney with a group of parishioners in the basement of St. Mary's Church in New Haven. Still true to its founding principles of charity, unity, and fraternity 125 years later, the Knights of Columbus has grown to the largest lay Catholic organization in the world with more than 1.7 million members.

Throughout its history, the Knights of Columbus has been an effective advocate and defender of civil and religious rights for all. The organization has also contributed billions of dollars and millions of hours of volunteer service to charity. This site recalls many prominent events in the Knights of Columbus' history and offers the Supreme Knight's view for its future."

For those who have not had the chance to read up on some of the more noteworthy events in the Order's history, this site offers a nice run down of some historical highlights. For those of you who are more familiar with the Order's history, the site is a good reminder of who we are and why we do what we do. I suggest you spend a few minutes perusing what it has to offer.
