Worthy Sir Knights:

I would like to congratulate each of our new Sir Knights. In receiving the fullness of Knighthood, you have become part of the visible arm of the Order. As such, I'd like to take a moment and discuss the uniform of a Sir Knight.

In its most basic form, the uniform for the Fourth Degree is a black tuxedo (plain black jacket, trousers, shoes, socks; white pleated shirt) with a social baldric and white gloves. The baldric is worn across the chest and under the jacket from the right shoulder to the left hip. To display our love for country, it is appropriate to wear a lapel pin of the US flag on the left lapel. Likewise, a Fourth Degree pin may be worn below the flag pin. A name badge may be worn on the left breast pocket, with miniature jewels of office for offices previously held pinned under the badge. Additionally, an Emblem of the Order jewel may be worn under the miniature jewels. A Sir Knight who is currently serving in an office in the Order may wear the jewel of office of the highest office he holds, be it on the Third or the Fourth Degree level... in my case, the Grand Knight's jewel supercedes the Faithful Captain's jewel.

The uniform for the Color Corps is almost identical, with a few changes. For starters, neither the name badge nor the Emblem of the Order is worn with the regalia, and the social baldric is replaced by the service baldric, which is worn outside the jacket and closes at the hip. A sword is then attached to the service baldric; a cape worn over the shoulders (the chain goes under the tie); and a chapeaux is worn on the head, with the base remaining parallel to the ground.

While the uniform described above is important, so are the colors of the cape worn. All Sir Knights are entitled to wear a red cape with a white plumed chapeaux, and carry a black handled sword. This is the only time the plume does not match the color of the cape. A current Commander wears purple, while a District Marshal wears green. Typically, there is only one Commander and only one Marshal at an event, although a Master may allow for additional Commanders and Marshals. Current and Past Faithful Navigators are entitled to wear white, as well as a white handled sword. Current and Former Masters are entitled to wear gold, as well as a gold handled sword. Current and Former Vice Supreme Masters and Supreme Masters are entitled to wear light blue.

In closing, I encourage each of our Sir Knights to consider joining the Color Corps. Each Sir Knight in our Assembly who purchases his cape and chapeaux during the first year in the Fourth Degree will receive a sword paid for by the Assembly... this is a \$100 value! We will be holding Color Corps certification at the January meeting, so now's the time to join!

The honored tradition of a Sir Knight's Chalice of the 4th Degree recently left Virginia, and ended up at a school, in Portsmouth, Rhode Island.

SK Dick Chapman of Fr. Malloy Assembly, Fairfax, VA passed away this last summer, 2003. Dick was very sick however had many visits by the Benedictines. SK Chapman always enjoyed and felt the peace of his last days with these Priests and Brothers who visited him in the hospitaL

One day, he mentioned that after he passed on, the Knights of Columbus always had a Memorial Chalice and Patton to be given at the request of the family to any priests. SK Chapman asked the Brothers, where his Chalice may go to help out, and out of respect for the many visits of the Benedictines. During the conversation, Portsmouth Abbey, a boys and girl's high school in Portsmouth, Rhode Island, about seven miles north of Newport, Rhode Island would be a possible place for this Chalice. Dick said then this is where it will go.

SK Dick Chapman passed on, and his Chalice on display at his wake, would soon be heading northbound to Portsmouth Abbey. On August 29, 2003, PFN Thomas J. Snee, Fr. Malloy Assembly, Fairfax, VA and PFN Keith Roberts, Gen Rosecrans Assembly, Newport, RI met and presented the Chalice and Patton to Abbot Dave Stark. The Abbot was very surprised and after many phone calls to Washington DC, he accepted the Chalice and Patton with deep humility. "Nothing like this has ever happened to the Abbey", said Abbott Stark. "We are very honored to be the recipients of this beautiful Chalice and Patton on behalf of the Abbey and the SchooL This Knight must have been a wonderful man to think of this delivery all the way from Virginia. Thank you, and God Bless you all".

SK Chapman's mortal remains are at Peace now with the Lord and his memory lives now up in Portsmouth, RI. There amongst the <u>Priests, Brothers</u> <u>and Students of Portsmouth Abbey</u>.
