Faithful Comptroller's Report

As of January 2, 2018, Fr. Walter F. Malloy Assembly has 316 Sir Knights, a decrease from December of one Sir Knight due to transfer. The 316 Sir Knights does not include three Sir Knights (SK Matthew J. Baumgartner, SK Francis B. Hallahan, and SK Gregory W. Miller) who were welcomed into our Assembly as transfers during the December meeting. Supreme is processing their transfers.

Current Dues

Dues notices were sent out in early December, and as a reminder, dues are payable upon receipt of the dues notices. Thanks to all Sir Knights who have remitted payment thus far. For those who have not remitted payment, please do so at your earliest opportunity. There is a grace period of one month—through January 31 for your 2017 membership card to be accepted at meetings. A Second Notice will be sent in early February to those with dues outstanding.

Any Sir Knights having financial or other difficulties, and unable to remit payment at this time should contact me to discuss and/or make alternative payment arrangements.

By-Laws Change—Dues

As previously mentioned, a motion/resolution was made to increase Assembly dues from \$20 per year which has been in place for many years. The original motion was made to increase to \$24 per annum; however, an amendment to the original motion was made at the December meeting to increase the dues to \$30 per year. The amended motion was approved by the Assembly membership to increase the dues to \$30 per annum. We have submitted and received approval for the By-Laws change from Supreme. Since our dues for the 2018 billing cycle is already underway, we will implement the \$30 dues for the 2019 billing cycle (dues notices will be sent in December 2018).

Religious Freedom Day Parade

Members of Fr. Malloy Assembly are invited and encouraged to participate in the annual Religious Freedom Day Parade in Fredericksburg on Sunday, January 14. Muster is at 12:45 PM at the Fredericksburg Train Station; we will be marching with Rappahannock Assembly, #1613. The parade begins at 1:30 PM, and will be followed by a Wreath Laying ceremony at the Religious Freedom Monument at 2 PM. A reception will follow the parade and wreath laying at 3 PM in the St. John Bosco Center, Catholic Campus Ministry, University of Mary Washington; all Knights are welcome to attend.

District Master SK Thomas A. Trudeau has this to say regarding the parade:

"We hear varying accounts of Religious Freedom and varied views on what Religious Freedom should entail. But what do each of us do to tangibly support the cause of Religious Freedom? Each January, we march for our Pro-Life cause. Why not support Religious Freedom in the same manner? Join us in Fredericksburg on Sunday, January 14, to celebrate the annual Religious Freedom Day. Come and be counted. Stand with others to show by your presence your support for our right to Religious Freedom."

Renewal of Obligations

At our meeting on Wednesday, January 17, we will once again renew the obligations we pledged at each of the Exemplifications. This annual event is our opportunity to recall the pledges of Secrecy, Unity, Fraternalism, and Patriotism that are the hallmarks of Order. Once again, our Brother Sir Knights from Fr. Casey Assembly will be joining us.

The attire for all Officers and Sir Knights is dark with a white shirt, a neck tie, a social baldric (worn OVER the tie), and the PG-113 pin (miniature 4th Degree Emblem... similar to the one received when taking the 4th Degree). Officers and Sir Knights may wear the New Uniform, but without any baldric.

In light of the ceremony and our guests, we will begin the rosary half an hour earlier at 7 PM; Sir Knights' Café will immediately follow the Rosary. The Renewal ceremony will begin at 8 PM, and will be followed immediately by an abbreviated meeting (we will only touch on time sensitive reports and motions; all other reports and motions will be tabled until the February meeting).

Delegates Needed

On Saturday, March 10, 2018, the Virginia District of the 4th Degree will be conducting its Biennial Meeting in Woodbridge. Among other things, it will be at this meeting that the District will select three the names of three Sir Knights to be submitted to Supreme for consideration to become the next District Master (current Master SK Thomas A. Trudeau is coming to the end of his second 2-year term, and is therefore no longer eligible to continue). It was at our October meeting that a Resolution of Support for District Secretary SK David J. Todd, Sr., PFN, was introduced and accepted unanimously by the Assembly.

Due to our Assembly's size, we are authorized to have up to four Delegates to the Biennial Meeting. FN Matthew T. West intends to attend, and will therefore be one of the Delegates. Anyone else interested in representing Fr. Malloy Assembly at this important meeting should contact FN West at their earliest opportunity, but no later than February 9th. We will vote on Delegates at the February 21st Assembly meeting.
