

On Patriotism

Several months ago, I was an exemplar in a degree ceremony – a second and third degree were being held back-to-back. Between the second and third, one of the candidates approached me and expressed his misgivings about something. He had read *Columbia* magazine, talked to several Knights, and listened intently to the words of the degree ceremonies. He wasn't sure if he should proceed to the Third Degree, he said, because he had grave misgivings about the current presidential administration's priorities and direction, and "...the Knights were so patriotic, and all."

I assured the man that there was no conflict in what he felt and what the Knights were about – that the Knights were by no means a partisan political organization. Our principle is love is for our country, and our system of government, and not love for a particular political party or ideology. He went on to receive his Third Degree.

But his question got me thinking. Often patriotism is conflated with partisanship, as in our increasingly partisan political world, extremists on each side of the political spectrum seek to demonize their opponents. And because our Order's call to patriotic activism is often tied to specific issues, the lines between advocacy for certain issues and advocacy for political parties can sometimes appear blurred.

Let this not be so! As proud Catholics and earnest defenders of the faith, I firmly believe we are called to vigorously defend certain issues when they appear in the public sphere. Abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide – these are part of the culture of death that the Holy Father has condemned, and which we must work against. But we speak against these not as partisan political advocates, but as advocates for a respect for the basic principle that human life is sacred. We support some positions held by one major political party, and some positions held by the other. Our concern is issues, not political allegiance.

In this country, every citizen has an equal claim to voice and vote. That is the system we love as patriots, and the call to participate in that system is what we heed as patriots. Giving voice to our concerns in this way is an excellent exercise of our patriotic duty, and of the love we have for our nation. Let your own voice be heard!
