Historian Report

"Victory has a hundred fathers. Defeat is an orphan."

That wryly cynical observation came from President John F. Kennedy's musing about the failed Bay of Pigs invasion, but I was reminded of it as I reviewed the events leading to one of our Order's most visible and patriotic contributions to American civic life: the addition, in 1954, of the words "under God," to the Pledge of Allegiance. Sources are replete with various candidates for credit. Michigan Congressman Louis C. Rabaut (D) sponsored a bill to make the change in 1953. Pastor George MacPherson Docherty of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, DC, gave a sermon on the Gettysburg Address while President Eisenhower was attending the service, and Docherty reportedly suggested that LIncoln's phrase "Under God," from the Gettysburg Address would set the Pledge apart from similar ones from other nations.

But as it happens, men like Rabaut and Docherty, worthy traveling companions that they were, did not do the heavy lifting for this task. The primary movers and shakers for this change were the American Sir Knights of the Fourth Degree.

In April of 1951, two years before Rabaut's bill and Docherty's sermon, the Board of Directors approved a 4th Degree resolution to permit every assembly in the country to modify the Pledge as it was recited before meetings to insert the words, "Under God," between "One nation," and "indivisible." And as 4th Degree Knights took the habit back to their councils, it caught on there as well, so much so the next Supreme Council adopted a resolution extending the practice Order-wide.

As it happened, the Knights of Columbus was a member of the National Fraternal Congress, an umbrella group of fraternal orders. And as it happened, the President of the National Fraternal Congress that year was Luke Hart—who was also our Supreme Knight. To no one's surprise, the National Fraternal Congress adopted similar resolutions, and copies of all these were sent to all members of Congress.

President Eisenhower signed H.J.Res. 243 into law on Flag Day 1954. The joint resolution passed both House and Senate by unanimous consent.

It is perhaps worthwhile to ask ourselves what chance a similar resolution might have today. But I think we know the answer. Indeed, the phrase has weathered legal attack in recent years. In 2004, an atheist from California sued his local school district based on the inclusion of the words in their daily pledge recital. But in *Elk Grove Unified School District v. Newdow*, the Court turned back the challenge. The primary basis for the rejection was the fact that challenger Newdow was not personally affected by the school's practice—he was trying to sue on behalf of his daughter, and the Court found as a non-custodial parent he could not. But several justices wrote separately to affirm the position that including "Under God," did not violate the US Constitution's religious Establishment Clause.

Today, the appetite to attack even ceremonial representations of religious faith has grown and extended in slightly different directions. Today, what is under attack are not words, but physical property: statutes of religious figures pulled down and destroyed with little regard for their presence on private property.

Perhaps, then, the lesson is that today we need voices raised in support of our nation, established under God, much more than we did in 1954.
