September begins the busy time for Fr. Malloy Assembly. The summer vacation period is over and its time to once again settle down to routine business, both in the business world and in Fr. Malloy Assembly. At our last meeting on September 20 we set the pace for the rest of the Assembly year.

The new District Master, Richard (Richie) Head, PSD and his lovely wife joined us for our open meeting and installed this year's slate of officers. The installation went well and there was only need to have one stand-in to cover an excused absence. Prior to the Installation we conducted a brief business meeting and elected Sir Knight Jack Cotner to the position of one year trustee to fill a vacancy in that position. SK Cotner is a Past Grand Knight of Fr. Diamond Council and over the years has been active in assembly affairs both at our meetings and in Color Corps appearances. I also want to thank Assembly members from St Mary of Sorrows Council for turning out in regalia to serve as Honor Guard for the proceedings. It is my hope to involve members from other member council's in Color Corps activity. Finally, another member from St. Mary of Sorrows council handled the meal for the evening. Captain and SK Dick Lee provided a great meal for all attendees. SK Lee is also searching for other members of the Assembly to step forward and volunteer to prepare a meal for one of our remaining meetings. The month of October also promises to be a very busy month for the Assembly. As you read this Log our Color Corps will have made several appearances, most notably at the Columbus Day Ceremony at Union Station in the D.C. and at a wreath laying ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington Cemetery. Both events occurred on October 9th.

Finally, the most significant event of the month will occur on October 27th and 29th with the Exemplification of the Fourth Degree at the Fairview Marriot Hotel in Northern Virginia. Monday, Oct 9, at the Columbus Monument at Union Station. Honor Guard with full regalia.


