

Upcoming Events:

October 8th – The annual Columbus Day ceremony will be conducted on Monday, October 8th, at Union Station in Washington, DC. The festivities will begin at 11:00 AM and all members should plan to be at the statue no later than 10:15 AM to finalize our activities. This is a major event for our Order and needs (and deserves) all of the support that we can give it. The Knights of Columbus sponsored the legislation for the monument to our namesake and this year marks its centennial anniversary. The Vice Supreme Master has asked that this be made a Provincial event, meaning that our Virginia Sir Knights will be assisted by Color Corps members from Washington DC, Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware. In addition, the Honor America Corps from Rappahannock Assembly will be there with all of the historical flags of the United States and will also need our help. October 8th - Father Walter F Malloy Assembly 1894 has been invited to place a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknowns, Arlington National Cemetery, at 4:00 PM. The Faithful Navigator, Color Corps Commander, Faithful Captain, and Faithful Admiral will participate in the ceremony. A standby assemblage of Sir Knights could provide a good public witness to Columbianism.

October 13th – Diocesan pilgrimage led by Bishop Loverde to the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC.

In as much as Bishop Loverde is extremely supportive of the Knights of Columbus, I believe that we should do everything possible to show our support for him and his Diocese. We are being asked to support two major parts of the day's events -- the opening processional and the closing Mass. The pilgrimage is expected to be completed by 3:00 PM. Please plan to arrive in full regalia (less the sword which is not allowed in the Basilica) 45 minutes prior to the start of the opening procession at 8:30 AM and for the Mass at 12:00 PM.
