The Pílot's Portal Sir Knights!

As the visible arm of the Knights of Columbus, we in the Fourth Degree are privileged to give public expression of our faith.

This past month, seven Sir Knights in regalia supported his Excellency Bishop Loverde at the procession of statues of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Queen of Apostles parish.

The Flag: Its History

The evolution of the American flag marks the progression of the government of the American people. From the founding of Jamestown in Virginia in 1607, until 1775, the Flag of England was the Flag of the peoples of America. In 1775, the Pine Tree Flag was adopted for all colonial vessels, and this was the banner carried by the Continental forces in the Battle of Bunker Hill. This flag was a green pine tree on a white background. The Southern colonies from 1776 to 1777 used the Snake Flag. This flag was a coiled black snake with the words "Don't Tread on Me" all on a bright yellow background.

In the latter part of 1775 the Continental Congress appointed a committee to consider a single flag for the thirteen colonies. What resulted was a flag of thirteen alternate stripes of red

and white, with an azure field in the upper corner bearing the red cross of St. George and the white cross of St. Andrew, both prominent Christian symbols. John Paul Jones raised this flag to the masthead of his flagship, "Alfred" on December 3, 1775 and one month later it was raised over the headquarters of General George Washington at Cambridge, Mass., in compliment, as he wrote, "to the United Colonies."

- I look forward to this year as your new Color Corps Commander with enthusiasm. It is exhilarating to think about the impact we can have on people's lives, yet I am deeply humbled by the confidence and trust this Assembly has bestowed upon me.

You may heard, or read, that to make a difference, a good Knight only needs to dedicate 24 hours a year. It goes something like this: 10 hours participating in council sponsored church, community, youth or charity projects 4 hours attending two council meetings

4 hours attending with your family a council social function

4 hours attending with your family two council sponsored mass or prayers

2 hours reading the council bulleting or information in the K of C websites

Building on this idea, a good Sir Knight needs to dedicate only and additional eight hours a year to our Assembly to make a difference: On July our we provided Color

3 hours attending two Assembly meetings 3 hours participating in a major Calvert Province or State Color Corps event 2 hours participating in one local event with one of our parishes or councils

It can be difficult to carve time to participate in the Color Corps events, but it is well worth the effort. You will know immediately that you are making a difference. If you



done this, I need not describe it. If you have never done this, no words can suffice. Make this the year you find out. What would be the impact if only a third of the SKs reading this participate in the next parade, or at the next event at the Cathedral or the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception?

On July our we provided Color Guards and Honor Guards for the installation of officers or Fr. Diamond Council in Pope Leo the Great and Pope John Paul II Council at Queen of the Apostles. On August 10 our Assem-

bly provided an Honor Guard for a memorial mass for Fr. Molloy and Fr. Nudd at St. Timothy's Parish in Chantilly, followed by a wreath laying ceremony at their tombs in Fairfax Memorial. Four Malloy Assembly Sir Knights where joined by SK's from Acts of Apostles Assembly for a 10 men Honor Guard. On the same day, Six SKs from our Assembly were joined by a SK from Marian Assembly to provide an Honor Guard for the Celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Queen of Apostles. This high visibility event in the Hispanic community included a procession of statues of the Blessed Virgin from over 20 countries in Central and South America. Bishop Loverde was the main celebrant, and he thanked many times our support.

Around the corner is Columbus Holiday, which our Assembly observes with ceremonies at the Columbus memorial in DC and laying the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown in Arlington. We made a difference in July, let's continue making a difference the rest of the year.
