Faithful Comptroller's Report

Worthy Sir Knights,

As of August 1, 2018, Fr. Malloy Assembly membership stands at 312 Sir Knights. This is a decrease of 6 members from our July roster who have been suspended for non-payment of dues.

Assembly Dues

Each Assembly, as with each Council of the Order, assesses dues to its members. The dues assessed by the Assembly are separate from Council dues. Assembly dues helps to fund the various patriotic events, charitable donations, and social functions. Currently, Assembly dues are set at \$20 annually based on the January 1-December 31 calendar year. However, starting with the upcoming 2019 calendar year, the dues will increase to \$30 annually. This increase was approved by an Assembly vote to amend our by-laws in December 2017.

Dues are payable upon receipt of the dues/billing notice. There are 39 Brothers who are in arrears for 2018 and in some cases prior years. By joining the 4^{th} degree and signing the Form 4 (4^{th} Degree Membership Form, members agree to the assessment and payment of their assembly dues. Membership cards are not provided to members unless their dues have been paid.

Members experiencing financial hardship, disability, or other reasons for not being able to remit dues payment should contact me as soon as possible to discuss. I am willing to help in working out alternative solutions, but I need to hear from said member(s).

Heroes Mass

On Sunday, September 9th, Fr. Malloy Assembly will host its 3rd annual Heroes Mass. This Mass honors those men and women in uniform, both Military and First Responders, who put their lives on the line to protect and serve our nation and our communities.

Recently, one of our Brother Knights in Newport News was the beneficiary of the good works of First Responders. Here is his story as told by his son, another Knight and an old classmate of Faithful 3-Year Trustee SK David J. Todd, Jr., PFN.

On April 19th my father experienced chest pains while working in the front yard of his home. My father is a former U.S. Army 1st Sergeant, and as tough as they come... so at first, he dismissed it as "nothing." However, after a convincing telephone conversation with my brother, my father called 911.

The firefighters and paramedics from Newport News Fire Station #6 arrived very quickly, assessed my father's condition, (and) immediately identified that he had a heart attack, and provided immediate care. A short time later my father was on a stretcher and in the back of an ambulance heading to Riverside Regional Medical Center. My father later learned from his surgeon that if had waited ten minutes to call 911, he would not be here today. My father has often mentioned how grateful he is to the paramedics who saved his life, and how much he wishes that he could personally thank each of them.

My brother celebrated his 52^{nd} birthday today and invited our entire family and his best friend to his house for a barbecue. Unbeknownst to my parents, my brother and sister-in-law secretly asked the paramedics from Station #6 to his home for lunch. You can only imagine how shocked my mother and father were to see the five paramedics, two of which personally aided my father the day he had his heart attack, walk into my brother's backyard. It was a very emotional moment for my father and mother. Today's meeting not only offered my parents an opportunity to say thank you, but it also provided my parents a sense of closure to a very traumatic event.

Words cannot describe how thankful my family and I are for the excellent care that the men and women of Fire Station #6 provided my father and the kindness and sensitivity they showed my mother. We are forever indebted to you.
