Didymus Doubtful

Through the centuries, many non-believers from other faiths and atheism have cast doubt on the veracity of the Gospels. The virgin birth, the miracles, the conversion of multitudes, and especially the Resurrection from the dead have been characterized as a hoax for the consumption of the credulous. But here and there are parts of the story that on reflection support the sense that what our forefathers and we have accepted as true is indeed so.

The apostle St. Thomas before the Passion tells the others that they should go with Christ to die with Him in Jerusalem. However, when the Crucifixion occurs, he is in hiding with other apostles. After the Resurrection, Christ appears to the group, but St. Thomas, having been absent, says he will only believe if he is able to personally verify the wounds.



Since he was not present at the Crucifixion, how did he really know what the wounds were?

He was likely among those that laid Our Lord in the Holy Shroud at His burial. That is how he would have seen and touched the holes in His hands and feet and side.

At the next appearance, Jesus grants St. Thomas his condition and says, "Be not faithless, but believing" (Jn 20:22). The Lord encountered and dispelled the doubt of St. Thomas who had seen his grievously wounded dead body. Let us not be with the doubters, but rather stand with St. Thomas to say, "My Lord and my God!"

Color Corps Commander Needed

Fr. Malloy Assembly is in need of a new Color Corps Commander as soon as possible. **SK David J. Todd, Jr., PFN**, agreed to serve as a Color Corps Commander until such time as a new Commander could be identified; due to increasing responsibilities in his life, SK Todd resigned as the Color Corps Commander effective February 28th. The responsibilities are fairly simple:

- Communicate with Assembly members regarding "Callouts" for Color Corps activities.
- Submit a monthly report to the Assembly, both via newsletter, and via verbal report at Assembly meetings.
- Instruct Color Corps members prior to activities.
- Command Color Corps, using verbal commands as well as silent commands (depending on situation).

Ideally, the Color Corps Commander should (but is not necessarily required to) have:

- The New Uniform (Legacy Regalia may be used until June 30th... after that, New Uniform will be required).
- Attended Color Corps & Color Corps Commander Training within the past year
- Foresight to understand the requirements and expectations of the Color Corps in specific circumstances.

Our Assembly has several Associate Commanders available to assist, and as needed to step in as Commander, in various activities... so do not feel pressured to be at every event. We will accept someone to take Command for the remainder of this fraternal year if they need to use Legacy Regalia (we have the purple cape and chapeau that they will use!). New Uniform

As has been announced previously, the Legacy Regalia (Cape & Chapeau) will be retired on June 30, 2019; following that date, NO ONE is authorized to wear it any longer. Currently, 18 Sir Knights in Fr. Malloy Assembly have purchased the New Uniform, with another 4 planning to purchase it by the end of the calendar year, if not the end of this fraternal year.

All Sir Knights who participate in Color Corps activities should consider purchasing the New Uniform. Those who have appreciate the feel and the ease (no cumbersome boxes or garment bags are needed to transport cape and chapeaux, it is lighter weight, and breaths easier than the wool tuxedo under the lined cape).

Anyone interested in purchasing the New Uniform should go to www.kofcuniform.com. You should be professionally measured prior to placing the order (be aware they still run a little small). The cost for the New Uniform (which includes trousers, blazer, tie, and beret) is \$510, plus shipping. Once you receive it, you will need to have the trousers & blazer altered (the trousers come unhemmed), and will need to shape your beret. Additionally, you will need to purchase a sword and service baldric, which can be done through www.kofcsupplies.com. The cost of a basic package (sword, baldric, and sword case) is \$199, plus shipping. For new Sir Knights who order their New Uniform and Sword within the first year, the Assembly will reimburse up to \$150 of the purchase price of the sword... just submit a copy of your receipt to Faithful Comptroller SK William W. Weich, PFN.

Faithful Admiral's Report



Worthy Sir Knights,

There is still time to recruit for the April Exemplification of the Fourth Degree. The Exemplification for the Fourth Degree will be Saturday, April 27, 2019, at St. Edward the Confessor Catholic Church & School (2700 Dolfield Dr, Richmond, 23235). The Exemplification will begin at Noon (Candidates must arrive no later than 11 AM).

The only requirement for taking the Fourth/Patriotic Degree is that a Candidate be a Third Degree Knight prior to the Exemplification. The initiation fee is \$70 per Candidate, which we ask accompany the Form 4 (checks should be made payable to *Fr. Malloy Assembly*). This fee includes the Candidate's luncheon ticket, Fourth Degree Social Baldric, Fourth Degree Lapel Pin, certificate, and processing fees. During the Exemplification, Candidates must wear a black, dark gray, or dark blue suit (brown, green, or other color suits are not permitted!). Shirts must be plain white with a basic/conservative style tie. Priests should be dressed in clerical attire; Deacons may wear should follow Diocesan guidelines. Active duty Military may wear their Class A or Dress Uniform; First Responders (Police, Firefighters, Paramedics) may wear their Dress Uniform.

Sir Knights wishing to attend the Exemplification as Observers may wear a black, dark gray, or dark blue suit, or they may wear the New Uniform. For those wearing a suit, shirts must be plain white with a basic/conservative style tie; the Social Baldric should be worn under the jacket, but in front of the tie. Observers should wear the Fourth Degree Lapel Pin.

A concurrent program will be held for Ladies of Sir Knights and Candidates, which will include a planned trip to the Lewis Ginter Botanical Gardens in Richmond. There is an additional cost (\$20) for tickets to the Ladies Program. Registration and payment for the Ladies Program must be made through the Assembly.

There will be a luncheon following the Exemplification at St. Edward's Church at approximately 3 PM. Tickets for the luncheon for Sir Knights and Ladies are available for purchase through the Assembly (\$30 each; free for the Candidates).

Since this Exemplification will take place outside of Northern Virginia, the Assembly will be helping organize transportation for any Candidates interested in going down to Richmond on Saturday that would like a ride.

If you would like to go down and stay overnight Friday night, the District has arranged a hotel deal at the Four Points by Sheraton Richmond (9901 Midlothian Tpk, Richmond, 23235). Room cost is \$109, plus taxes & fees, per night. Reservation deadline is April 5. To make reservations, please call the Four Points by Sheraton Richmond at (804) 323-1144, and ask for the "Virginia Knights of Columbus rate." There will be a hospitality room at the hotel on Friday night for those Knights and their wives who are staying at the hotel.

In order to ensure we have applications submitted in time for the Exemplification, we will need to approve all applications by our March Assembly meeting.

This Exemplification is a great chance to afford our Brother Knights the opportunity to reach full patriotic Knighthood in the Knights of Columbus. I hope we can have a strong showing of our Assembly's desire to help our Brother Knights reach this goal.
