NAVIGATOR'S REPORT

Worthy Sir Knights

I had intended to start each of my messages in the log with a recap of what took place at the last Malloy Assembly meeting. However, during the summer months we are more likely to be on vacation and thus not in town for Assembly meetings. So it was at our August meeting when only twelve Sir Knights were in attendance and, according to our by-laws, the meeting was canceled. Now, as we enter into the fall of the year, hopefully our attendance will increase. We still have on the table an amendment to our by-laws that will lower the number needed for a quorum from 15 to 11. We must have 25 Sir Knights present to pass such an amendment and until then the amendment must remain on the table.

In all other aspects the month of August was a busy one for the Assembly and its Color Corps. We attended Mass for Fr Nudd, deceased Chaplin of Fr. Nudd Council and for Fr. Malloy our founding Chaplin and namesake. We later laid a wreath at the grave of Fr. Malloy, our founding chaplain. We attended Mass and a procession at Queen of Apostles Church in honor of our Blessed Mother Mary and we stood as Honor Guards for our deceased brothers; SK Don Hanson and SK John Ryan. The Fourth Degree is the most visible arm of the Knights of Columbus and it is through such acts as above that we demonstrate the principles upon which our order was founded. If you are a member of the Fourth Degree consider participating in such events when needed.

At our next meeting of the Assembly on Wednesday, Sept. 20th the Officers will be installed for the current Assembly year. The ceremony will begin at 7:30PM with a recitation of the Holy Rosary. A light luncheon will be provided and the Installation of Officers will follow. The New District Master, Richie Head will be in attendance and this will provide a great opportunity

to demonstrate to the new Master that Fr. Malloy Assembly is indeed a strong Assembly and ready to serve his needs as they occur. Please plan to attend this Installation and show your support for the Order, the Assembly and your fellow Sir Knights.

October will also be a busy month for the Assembly. On October 9th there will be ceremonies at Union Station in the District of Columbia in honor of our namesake, Christopher Columbus. All Sir Knights should make an effort to attend this ceremony. In recent years there have been demonstrations against Columbus and it is through our strength in numbers that we can show that we are proud to be members of the Knights of Columbus. Later the same day at 4:30PM we will be privileged to place a wreath at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery. Finally, on October 28th there will be the Fourth Degree Exemplification held at the Fairview Park Marriot Hotel in Falls Church, VA. Malloy Assembly already has 10 candidates for this exemplification but could use more. Please speak up at your Council Meetings and address the need for more members of the Fourth Degree.

The Pilot's Portal SK Bill Weich

As I mentioned in my Pilot's Portal a few months ago, I am continuing my practice if reviewing some of our nation's history. Previously, I wrote about Labor Day, Memorial Day, our National Anthem, and so on. This month, as part of my column, I will review another song that is part of our history and part of our Assembly meeting – America the Beautiful. America the Beautiful was first written in 1893 by Katherine Lee Bates a noted professor from Wellesley College, author and poet. Ms. Bates was on a train trip to Colorado Springs and had seen many sights along her journey. When she reached the top of Pike's Peak, she marveled at the wonder of America's views and was inspired to write the words to all eight verses of what many believe to be our country's unofficial national anthem.

As mentioned above, her first version was written in 1893, with additional versions in 1904 and 1913. The song first appeared in print on July 4th to commemorate another historical day in our nation's history) 1895 in the Congregationalist, a weekly journal, and quickly became popular. Within a few months, the lyrics were set to music by Silas G. Platt. For two years the poem was sung to any popular or folk tune that fit with the lyrics. The most popular of the tunes used was "Auld Lang Syne". Finally in 1926 the National Federation of Music Clubs held a contest to pen the poem to music. Unfortunately, none of the entries seemed to fit the poem. America the Beautiful is now sung to Samuel A. Ward's "Materna".

Due to the song's popularity in the last 100 years there have been attempts to make the song a national hymn, give it equal status as a second national anthem, or even to replace the "Star-Spangled Banner" as our nation anthem. However, these attempts have been unsuccessful. Americans' hold "America the Beautiful" in high esteem and the song gained more popularity than ever following the terrorist attacks on Sept. 11, 2001. I remember attending the 5pm Sunday Mass after 9/11 and instead of watching the early exit parade of people after communion, watched as everyone sang "America the Beautiful" in the recessional hymn. It can be found in many religious songbooks in the United States as well as heard at many sporting events, along with the "Star-Spangled Banner."

In closing, I ask for your continued prayers for our men and women defending our freedom and our United States of America. Vivat Jesus!


